EMBRACED BY GOD'S LOVE WE REACH OUT TO SERVE BECAUSE OUR REDEEMER LIVES



You are probably aware that Our Redeemer's has raised enough money to purchase all the milk needed to supply the Helena Food Share's "Kid Packs" program for the entire school district for the past several years. You may also know that each of the past several years, the church has secured grants in the many thousands of dollars to supplement the contributions of congregational members to accomplish that feat. But did you ever wonder who wrote those grant applications that raised that money? That would be Karen Nelson, who joined Our Redeemer's in the early 2000s with her husband, Brent.



Karen and Brent moved to Helena from Nebraska in 1999, when they both obtained jobs with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. They met in Lincoln, NE, in 1990, where Karen was in graduate school and Brent worked for Fish and Wildlife. After graduation, Karen also got a job with F & W, and they were married sometime later. Before meeting Brent, however, after graduation from Centre College in Kentucky with a degree in biology, Karen had traveled, lived, and worked around the world, including the United Kingdom, Greece, and Australia, for several years. She credits these experiences with her sense of adventure and her skills in writing job applications and grants to fund her travels.

After moving to Helena, Brent and Karen attended New Life Lutheran before discovering Our Redeemer's. They loved the sense of community at Our Redeemer's. Karen immediately connected with the Gardening Team, which later became the Hunger Team, and she has been active ever since. In addition to the Milk campaign grants, she wrote a grant to fund a drip irrigation system for the Community Garden. She also works with the Carroll College agronomy department, which grows seedlings for the garden, and she recruits students from that department to work in the garden, as well.

In 2019, Brent and Karen took advantage of an early retirement program and purchased property in the Spokane Hills area near Canyon Ferry Road. They have a very large garden, which, along with the game Brent hunts, provides much of their food needs. Karen is a Master Gardener and volunteers with the local Master Gardener program, and she is a member of the Montana Native Plant Society. During the winters, she volunteers with the Great Divide Ski Patrol. As you can probably tell from the photo, Karen and Brent LOVE dogs and have raised puppies for the Canine Companions program.

Karen is a great asset to our community and the Helena community at large; we are fortunate to count her and Brent as part of our fellowship.

Wear Blue on Sunday April 6!

In 1983, President Ronald Reagan proclaimed April as National Child Abuse Prevention Month. This month, many and varied organizations and agencies focus on raising awareness of both the problem and of the work many groups do to end the tragedy of child abuse. As a society, we still have a long way to go. Protective services receive millions of reports of child abuse and neglect each year to children. Hundreds of thousands of children are confirmed as victims of abuse or neglect annually. Approximately 1,600 children die every year in the U.S. due to abuse.

Blue is the signature color for child abuse awareness, as it represents the bruises of physical abuse and serves as a powerful call to action. Our Redeemer's will answer that call in part by observing **Blue Sunday** on **April 6**. when we will pray for God's power, comfort, and healing for abused children everywhere, for their abusers, and for those dedicated to protection and restoration. We will also display blue pinwheels throughout April as a reminder of our responsibility to care for these most vulnerable of God's children.

Many service groups rely on community support to mitigate the effects of and to end child abuse. 

The Long-Range Planning Committee has spent several months getting input from the congregation as they begin to create a strategic plan for our ministry together at Our Redeemer's. They visited with most of the groups that regularly meet (WELCA, youth group, Council, staff, men's group, Hunger Team, bell choir, Sunday fellowship time...), getting feedback on these questions:

- What is working well at Our Redeemer's?
- What could be working better?
- What are your hopes for the future?

Call Committee

Abigail McLane reported on the recommendation of the Call Committee. The Council received the recommendation and agreed to schedule a Congregational Meeting on Sunday, April 6, at 10:00 am for the purpose of voting on the candidate for Pastor.

Update on Solar Panels (Borrowing Resolution)

Herb Kulow reported that someone from the Church Council should be assigned to sign the borrowing resolution from Valley Bank on behalf of the Congregation. The immediate request is for the transfer of \$170,000 from the Horseshoe Bend account to a 12-month CD at 3.85%. Herb will bring more details about the requirements for borrowing against the CD to the April Council meeting.

Financial Report and Recommendations

Healthy giving was noted in February. February receipts for the Ministry Fund totaled \$50,349, and Building Fund donations totaled \$16,911. The Council agreed to transfer Building Funds of \$16,707.23 and Dedicated Funds of \$3,563.03 to the Mission Investment Fund, but held the Benevolence payment of \$4,262.69 because of the property tax bill that is due in May.

Ministry Team and Committee Reports

Staff reports continue to reflect healthy involvement in all aspects of the church. Pastor Trina has worked more with the preschool during the last few weeks while Brenda Stoltz was out for surgery. The preschool is expanding options for next fall, and there are still several openings for each age group.

Unfinished Business

Charlie Gorman has agreed to serve as First Vice-President of the Council.

New Business

- The Council supported the Call Committee's recommendation to offer the call as Pastor, rather than Associate Pastor, due to the candidate's level of experience.
- The Council approved the salary and benefits package to be offered to the candidate. As part of this process, the council also decided to offer the same housing allowance to both pastors. The housing allowance will be reviewed annually in order to be in line with present housing costs in the Helena area.

In our last update to the congregation, we reported that after Rocky Mountain Development Council determined they were unable to move forward with our development project, we were in communication with alternative affordable housing developers.

Since then, the committee had a very encouraging meeting with a local for-profit affordable housing developer who currently has a project called Twin Creek Apartments under construction here in Helena at the corner of Alice Street and Dorothy Street. That project has 72 units in total, providing a blend of one-, two-, and three-bedroom units. They also have a project in the pre-construction phase in Bozeman.

This developer introduced themselves to the committee and proposed developing just a portion of our property (approximately 4.3 acres) for 64 units of senior affordable housing. This was an intriguing proposal to the committee. While the land purchase price would be significantly less, they would be installing Horseshoe Bend Rd. and the church would retain the remainder of the property, which would then be much more valuable and developable since the access road would be in place.

Since that meeting date, there has been significant turbulence at the federal level which has trickled down to this developer and the entire affordable housing market. These affordable housing developers use a complex combination of Low-Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) and HUD grant funding to make these projects feasible. Recently, the market price for tax credits has become depressed, and HUD has cut a lot of staffing, creating uncertainty with their grant funding. This developer is concerned about HUD removing commitments they have already made to their Bozeman project.

So, while we feel like we may have found the right development group to make this happen, the current market and policy climate are not providing any assurance of success. We will continue to be in touch with this developer, and stay tuned to changing conditions.

Please continue to keep this group of discerners in your prayers.
