EMBRACED BY GOD'S LOVE WE REACH OUT TO SERVE BECAUSE OUR REDEEMER LIVES



Did you know that Our Redeemer's has its own elves who work constantly behind the scenes to help ensure that our worship services are welcoming and meaningful? These elves belong to an umbrella group known as the Altar Guild. Generally, Altar Guild refers to the folks who make sure we can

celebrate Communion each Sunday and who ensure the church's altar area is adorned appropriately for the various seasons and festival days of the church calendar. Lisa Williams-Mathews has led this group of women (no men...yet, except for Kevin) for 11 years. Altar Guild's members are Kristi Antosh, Lori Walter, Charlene Mayala, Sonja Amman, Shannon Bartole, Lori Chase, Sharon Langdorf, and Mary Williams. A subset of Altar Guild, coordinated by Lisa's sister, Kim Randall, makes the bread that becomes Christ's body in the Communion meal. Those members are: Audrey Schubring, Elaine Ulgenes, Ingrid Childress, Kim Randall, Lisa Mathews, Kristi Antosh, Lori Chase, Nelson Bock, Mary Robertson, Sandy Bay, and Tami Ellis. And even more people are involved in making our sanctuary beautiful. The Wednesday Men's group is always around when extra help is needed. Many thanks to Charlene Mayala and Blair and Gretchen Krumm for recently installing the beautiful blue banner hanging from the ceiling in the Sanctuary!

The routine work of preparing for each Sunday worship service includes filling approximately 200 tiny plastic cups with wine and grape juice, filling communion trays with those cups, filling candles with oil, cleaning and filling the baptismal font, cleaning the altar area, setting the Communion table, and cleaning up after service. Special services require additional tasks such as preparing candles for people to light on All Saints Sunday and at the Christmas Eve services and filling lots of wine and juice cups for Easter and Christmas!

Did you notice the big tree, the lights and greenery in the sanctuary, and the large nativity scene in the narthex that all appeared the first Sunday in Advent? Yep, that was the Altar Guild elves. They will also take down and store all those decorations after Epiphany (which is January 6 in 2025, in case you were wondering).

Speaking of the church calendar, Altar Guild decorates with colors designated for each season (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost) and special Sundays (Pentecost, Reformation Sunday, Easter, etc.). They do this mainly with 'paraments,' special banners and cloths that adorn the altar, altar area, and communion table. (The word 'paraments' comes the Latin word *paramentum*, meaning "adornment.") You've probably noticed and/or heard about a beautiful new set of white paraments. The white altar cloth was handwoven and donated by Delores Rosin in honor of her husband Larry. Janet Erickson and Charlene Mayala made the beautiful new guilts that are hanging at the front of the Sanctuary. A very talented artist is currently working to create a custom set of green paraments. As donations allow, more paraments will be commissioned to replace those in our inventory who are well past retirement age.

Executive Council Meeting Summary

In December, the Executive Council met on behalf of the entire Council.

Financial Report Review and Action

Payments to Building Fund, Dedicated Funds, Benevolence and Endowment were held until the end of December because property taxes are due December 31, and December giving will likely make up the difference so that all funds can be paid. Further action will be taken at the January Council meeting.

Acceptance of 2023 Audit

The Council accepted the 2023 audit and expressed appreciation to the Audit Committee (Mike Burke, Paula Marble, and Jan Martin) for their fine work. The Council will address the recommendations next year, including an inventory of property assets. Next year's Audit Committee will begin its work in the spring of 2025.

Update on Solar Energy Proposal

The Solar and More Team is preparing a proposal for Solar Energy panel installation. Several documents were shared with the Council. The Executive Council requested that the complete proposal, along with fact sheets, be ready to share with the Council prior to its January meeting.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Trina once again expressed extreme gratitude for the assistance of Jane Peachey and Dennis Trotter while we are in the process of seeking an associate pastor. She and Tracy Moseman have been working with the preschool board as they seek additional funding sources for the preschool and look at possible reconfiguration of class offerings.

We appreciate the discussions after church in November and the emails, notes, shared comments no matter how they came in.
