



After a week with our Associate Pastor candidate, who interviewed with the Call Committee and Pastor Trina and met with staff and Council members, the Call Committee has unanimously decided that we will NOT be calling this candidate to serve at Our Redeemer's.

Thank you for your unwavering prayers and support during this rather intense time. Our focus as a Call Committee is to find an individual who is a good fit for Our Redeemer's and will bring the gifts and talents the staff, Pastor Trina and the congregation need to further our many ministries together. We continue to listen to God and trust in the Holy Spirit's direction while we work within the synod's process. However, our focus remains centered on what is best for Our Redeemer's, and we are committed to that purpose. Your understanding and patience have been invaluable to us.

There have been some questions about the synod's process regarding candidates who are not yet ordained (first-call candidates, like our own Baird Linke). Once a pastor is ordained, they are "free agents" who can decide to move from one congregation to another as they feel the Spirit is leading them. The process for someone who has just graduated from seminary and is not yet an ordained pastor is different. In that case, the bishop guides the student to a call that is appropriate for them as they begin their ministry career. So, while we as a congregation cannot nominate a recently graduated student (like Baird), the bishop may present a recently graduated student to us as a candidate. If you have questions about this process. Pastor Trina would be happy to answer them. If you'd like to nominate an ordained pastor for the Call Committee and the congregation to consider for our Associate Pastor position, please pass that information on to a member of the committee.

Did You Know? A conversation with Delores Rosin about her history at Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church is a most joyous gift! If you don't know her, introduce yourself and enjoy her delightful stories! The highlights of her faith journey below are in her own words. Still, the part that's NOT included is the incredible inspiration Delores's faithful and joyful serving and mentoring have been for so very many of us in this congregation!

> It was years before I knew that God was forming a plan for my life. My husband, Larry, and I grew up in a farming community between Fairfield & Power, MT. His family were members of a little Lutheran Church (St. Paul) a few miles from my home. I had been baptized in the Lutheran Faith as a small child, but now circumstances made it difficult for me to attend this church. When I was nine, two neighbor families offered to pick me up each week for Sunday School and Worship. These faith-filled people

were part of God's plan! I learned of God's love for me through dedicated Pastors & teachers. At 14, I confirmed my faith and began teaching Sunday School, Summer Bible School & singing in the adult choir. It was at Luther League, (youth group) that I became aware of Larry....the rest is history!

In 1969, our family moved to Helena and were led to Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church. The congregation was ten vears old and was worshiping in the small Fireside Room. It didn't take long for our family to become involved. joined WELCA, Circle Bible Study, and choir, and I helped start and work the annual fall bazaars, sewed guilts for Lutheran World Relief and the community Friendship Center. I was privileged to help plan the kitchen in our new church. For several years, Larry and I were in charge of the funeral receptions and took care of mailing the Voice Newsletter each month. We asked retired members to help, which became a fun activity for all. Larry ushered on Sundays and helped to start a men's "coffee" group, which is still going strong. He helped maintain the property and building and made lasting friendships. Did I mention the gallons of paint he went through to keep all rooms in good condition?

I have seen this congregation enthusiastically plan and build a new sanctuary at our former location and put the same dedicated time and effort into constructing our new church on Benton Avenue. I have observed members rallying together during difficult situations, prayerfully led by the Spirit. I am thankful for leaders who make important decisions and keep us going in the right direction.

Though Larry passed away in 2019, his words live on... "Whether I'm here to worship or to change a burned-out light bulb, I know it's where I want to be. While I'm here to serve, I also receive countless blessings...in a warm handshake of welcome, support, and encouragement when I need it most... sharing laughter and joy when things are going well for me".

Delores concluded an earlier writing by saying, "CERTAINLY THE WORLD HAS CHANGED SINCE MY CONFIRMATION. IT WAS DIFFERENT FOR MY CHILDREN AND NOW FOR MY GRANDCHILDREN, BUT LET THE CHANGES COME!!! God has promised all generations ... "My Spirit abides among you; fear not." Haggai 2:5



April Financial Review and Action

Because of your generous and faithful giving (\$70,914 for the month of April), the Council approved the payment of all expenses for the month. This action includes a payment of \$11,019.72 to the Building Fund, \$3880.90 to Dedicated Fund, and \$2836.54 to the Montana Synod. These payments still leave a cash balance of \$44.399.60. It was noted that the property taxes of \$9729.97 are due on May 31.
