



#### JUNE 8: SKIDWAY WILDFLOWER HIKE



#### A Huge "THANK YOU!"

The Hunger Team is extremely grateful to everyone who assisted with its many endeavors during the 2024-25 school year. You assisted in assembling Kid Packs at **Helena Food Share** the first three Tuesdays of each month; you donated granola bars for the Kid Pack Program; you donated over \$26,500 for the Milk Campaign last summer. Hungry kids throughout our community have benefited from your great generosity. Your extreme care for our neighbors humbles us.

In addition, many of you pitched in to assist in hosting our **Family Promise** guests early in May. You set up and tore down the rooms to provide suitable bedroom space, did the laundry, spent the night as hosts, provided meals, and stopped by to encourage, visit, or make a special effort to celebrate Mother's Day with our guests. Thank you for continuing to serve our neighbors as they seek long-term housing.

WELCA hosted a lovely Spring Luncheon on May 10, and they asked attendees to bring hygiene products for our **Family Promise** guests. Your generous collection of products will provide hygiene kits for our quarterly guests for the next few years. Thank you, everyone, for your support and generosity. And thank you, WELCA, for sponsoring this event.

**Family Promise** is making progress on the construction of their new building, which is designed to house about 30 families on their property on Cooke Ave. The permits have been finished and groundbreaking happened in May. Churches will remain active by providing meals and housing for new families entering the program through the building process and after completion.

On **June 6 and 7**, **Family Promise** will sponsor a Jumble Sale. All donated items will be free to those who shop. If you have been doing some Spring Cleaning and organizing, they would love to share your charitable contributions with those in need. The sale will be held at the First Christian Church (406-465-9467).

Carroll College students have planted root crops and have started pepper, tomato, and onion plants to be planted in the **Community Garden** in June. Look for more information later. The Hunger Team will continue to provide fresh produce for Helena Food Share as much as possible without a garden manager for that section. Elaine Ulgenes is handling all the rental spots. We are especially grateful for her willing hands. The Hunger Team can still use help with planting, weeding, and harvesting the Helena Food Share plot, raspberries, grapes, etc. And yes, **the Hunger Team could use your help**. Don't hesitate to stop by, smell the flowers, pull a few weeds, or just listen to the meadowlarks sing. The Community Garden is just that: it is for all of you. This project is too big to be handled only by the Hunger Team.

Thanks to the generosity of an organization in Missoula, the Hunger Team recently donated two boxes of socks to **Family Promise** and eight boxes to **God's Love**. Each box holds 160 pairs of socks. God is good!

The Milk Campaign for Helena Food Share will commence early in September to coordinate with the beginning of school and grant deadlines. Our goal for this year's campaign is \$25,300. And we have already received a \$1000 grant from the Montana Synod Hunger Team to launch our campaign. Extra milk bottles for storing change for the campaign are available by the Helena Food Share display in the hallway outside the sanctuary. Feel free to pick one up at your convenience. Children and youth in the church received these milk bottles in May for use during the summer.

We will explore the story of Jesus' disciples and the early church as they grieve and wrestle with what it means to be without him. Using lessons from the books of Acts and 1 Timothy, we will discover how these early Christians persevered and how God transformed their hearts and minds so they could move forward.

During our four sessions, we will explore captivating stories and fascinating characters that shaped the foundation of our Christian faith, and how often they had to be freed from their mistaken ideas about God and what God wanted. These stories include:

- disciples transformed into living candles by the Holy Spirit;
- Peter defending the disciples of being drunk because they can speak in other languages;
- Stephen being lapidated (killed by stoning) because he challenged religious leaders with the truth;
- Peter's vision (of pigs in a blanket) that transforms his understanding of cleanliness and membership;
- Paul's 10,000-mile journey through the Roman Empire (including the Wonders of the Ancient World) that establishes the early Christian churches;
- the relentless efforts made by God to help us understand that everyone is included and loved, especially those we believe shouldn't be included or loved (the Ethiopian Eunuch, the Purple Woman, the Roman Centurian, and the Demon Possessed); and how false teachers and teachings have always existed in the church, from its very beginnings, and we'll expose false teachings in the church today.



Jesus tells a parable about a prudent manager who is put in charge while his master is away. The master later returns to find the manager faithfully doing his job. He is then given control over all the master owns. Jesus compares him to another manager who, seeing that his master is delayed, beats the slaves, eats, and gets drunk. He is rightfully punished.

We, to whom much has been given, also make our choices concerning the blessings God has given us, whether it is our home, family, friends, work, leisure, resources, and this precious Earth. Will we continue to take care of it all (have dominion) over what we have been charged to steward, or will we be like the foolish manager who partied away his time and let important duties slide?

Our current climate situation calls us to respond to the many stress signals God's Earth is giving us - drastic heat, floods, storms, fires, etc. We Lutherans don't like to talk much about judgment, but is the judgment (i.e. natural consequences) already happening?

Now that we are more aware of the outcomes of our human activities, can we find ourselves faithfully working toward a better world, Earth-wise and otherwise?

#### **Solar Project Update**

Several people have asked about the status of our solar project, so here's an update:

Our application for a renewable energy grant from NorthWest Energy's Universal Systems Benefit Fund was submitted prior to the May 1 deadline. Now we just wait for a decision from the Grants Selection Board. As of late, those decisions have been made four to five months after the grant deadline, so we may not hear their response to our application until mid-to-late summer. Whether we receive a grant and how much we receive depends on several factors, including the amount of money in the fund available for this grant cycle, how many applications are received, and the geographical distribution of those applications, in addition to the relative merits of the applications. We believe we have a very strong application, so we are hopeful.

#### **April Financial Report and Recommendations**

General Receipts for April totaled \$65,798. Building Fund donations for April totaled \$11,224. Dedicated Fund donations for April totaled \$4,959.20. The Council moved to forward the Building Fund and Dedicated Funds to the Mission Investment Fund and to pay \$500 to Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp. They further decided to hold Synod donations until a later date, as property taxes of \$9,783.22 are also due this month.

#### **Ministry Team and Committee Reports**

Staff members reported numerous activities and active involvement in all aspects of the church during April. The preschool concludes its school year on Thursday, May 22. Registrations for next year's preschool are lower than expected. A postcard drop will help spread the word about openings for the 2025-26 school year.

The Outreach Ministry reported on the generous donations of the congregation through the 2024-25 school year. As noted earlier, congregation members generously assisted Lutheran World Relief by donating items for baby kits, school kits, guilts, and personal care kits. 
## MEET THE GRADUATEST
