Caregivers share the gift of love on a daily basis. Our support group seeks to be a safe place to encourage and uplift those who provide for loved ones.





In March, we will be working to complete the MSP if possible, as this is the first step in getting the search for candidates really rolling. Financial Review

Sarah Magee reported to the council that ministry receipts for January totaled \$54,023, which was \$6969 more than January 2022, and \$9084 less than the ministry plan. Building fund donations for January totaled \$7533, which is \$6572 less than January 2022 and \$3400 less than the monthly mortgage payment. There is a positive cash balance of \$12,740.26. The council approved the payment of our \$500 benevolence offering to Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp.

It was noted that building fund donations are falling behind the mortgage payments. Although there are funds that are still allocated, which allow for monthly payments, in light of increased interest rates, there is a need for increased donations to this fund.

Ministry Team and Committee Reports

- The Council expresses its great appreciation for all the efforts put forth by Jason Callon for the extra work he has put into making our worship experiences meaningful during Pastor Trina's illness.
- The property development committee is waiting for word from the city about allocation of ARPA funds. There is ongoing discussion regarding the relocation of the gas line near Horseshoe Bend.
- Preschool is working on recruitment and summer programing.
- Outreach and Welcoming committee is working on providing worship assistants.
- Hunger Team is working to secure grant funding for matching its annual summer milk campaign. Kendra Wilde Hunger Endowment funds of \$295.60 have been donated to Lutheran World Relief for earthquake relief in Turkey and Syria.

Congregation Constitution

A task force is being established to update the current congregation constitution to bring it into alignment with the ELCA 2022 model constitution for congregations.

ORLC Property Development Planning Update

On January 20th, 2023 Rocky Mountain Development Council (RMDC), acting as proposed lead developer for our property development project, made official application to the city for a portion of the available ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funding. RMDC was one of seven agencies who filled out Letters of Intent for ARPA



funds and were invited to submit a full application. The full list of invited projects included:

Carroll College/Nelson Stadium Lighting
Family Promise/Emergency Shelter
Helena Food Share/Food Resource Center
Helena Regional Sports Assoc./ Sustainability Study for Recreation Center
Rocky Mtn. Development Council/Our Redeemer's Housing Project
Tri-County Fire Safe Working Group/Fire Safety Audits
United Way/Meal & Hygiene Mobile Units

All of the applications are available on the City Commission's website, under Agenda & Meeting Packets, for the February 1st Administrative Meeting.

On February 1st the City Commission listened to a presentation by city staff which included a presentation on the status of ARPA funding decisions and priorities. The four priorities established by the commission for this funding include:

Priority 1: Programs/Projects Benefitting Vulnerable Populations

Priority 2: Public Health & Safety

Priority 3: Programs/Projects that Improve Quality of Life

Priority 4: Economic Development

Using a rubric designed by city staff which included evaluation criteria like alignment with commission priorities, the RMDC/Our Redeemer's Housing Project received 69 points. Helena Food Share's new Food Resource Center project received 70 points and the next closest ranking project received 41 points. This all looks like positive news, but the commission has yet to make any final decisions about the use of its ARPA funds. There was a Joint City/County Commission meeting held February 1st at which the City Commission asked the County Commission to participate in helping to fund a shortlist of projects that would be of benefit to both entities. There was a general sense of wanting to cooperate, but no formal commitments were made.

Again, during this period of decision-making by the commissions, we encourage you to write a letter or email to our Mayor and City Commissioners encouraging them to support the ORLC Affordable Housing Project with ARPA funding. For more information and tips about how to write a letter in support of our project, please contact Gretchen Krumm at gretchen@mosaicarch.com. She will provide you with a bullet-list of talking points you could include in your letter along with email addresses for City Commission members.
