#### **CAREGIVER'S SUPPORT GROUP**





If you want to know what's going on at Our Redeemer's ask Jerry or Judy Hoover and they can probably tell you. Life in the Lutheran Church started out for Judy at First Lutheran Church in Wolf Point, Montana. She and Jerry met at Montana State University and were married.

Judy's parents moved to Helena and started attending Our Redeemer's and soon Judy was attending with them. Like the women who were the first evangelists, Judy soon was telling Jerry about Our Redeemer's. Jerry had no church upbringing, but when Pastors Doug and Brenda Pederson were here Jerry was baptized as an adult and confirmed by Pastor Doug. That's the way disciples are made, person to person, one by one, many times within our own family. Evangelism and discipleship are about relationships.



The relationships that Jerry and Judy have made within the church have been meaningful and lifegiving. Judy has served behind the scenes singing in choir, helping with the newsletter, taking meals to new parents, and serving on the funeral reception committee.

Jerry has never been a joiner, but when our new church was being built he was fully a part of a team of volunteers that helped the Mission Builder's for two summers build the church from the ground up. Soon Jerry was organizing and recruiting volunteers to help build the church. He says that meaningful engagement with other members was its own reward. From that group of committed volunteers a core group was established that continues to meet as the men's group on Wednesday morning.

He continues to serve on the Property Development Committee working on contracts, the buy-sell agreement, and other essentials for selling our current land for the wonderful housing development that is being planned.

Judy and Jerry have enjoyed the small groups they have been a part of since Carol Will first asked them to join. They have been inspired going to Guatemala on several mission trips, seeing the strong faith and joy of the local people even though they are not materially rich. They have also joined Mission Builders on mission trips to Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp and the Synod House.

They are excited to see Our Redeemer's growing and reaching out to the community in so many ways. The Preschool is another great blessing and outreach to our community. But it all comes down to meaningful relationships, relationships with other brothers and sisters of the faith at Our Redeemer's and relationships with people in our community.

<u>Creation Hikes</u> are a fellowship opportunity to join one another in a community while enjoying God's creation together. There will be three hikes this summer: June 2, July 14, and August 18. Gretchen and Blair Krumm will lead the hikes, which depart from the Church parking lot at 11:00am. These moderate hikes are open to all ages.

#### **JUNE 2: Wildflower Hike**

On June 2, we have a special treat for you-a Wildflower hike at Skidway Campground. Located on US Highway 12 in the Deep Creek Canyon, about 21 miles east of Townsend, this hike offers two options. You can choose a one-mile hike up to a meadow that is usually adorned with a stunning array of wildflowers. From there, you can either head back to

your cars for a 2-mile out and back trip, or continue on a loop trail that is about 4-4.5 miles round trip back to the campground. Leashed dogs are welcome to join. We'll meet in the south church parking lot at 11am for carpooling and departure. Remember to bring lunch and water; bear spray is recommended for your safety.

On **Saturday, May 18**, our Redeemer's Lutheran Church is scheduled to volunteer at Habitat for Humanity's current build site in Highland Meadows Subdivision in East Helena. The build is from 9:00am-4:00pm on Saturday. This is a time for the congregation to come together to physically help build a home for a family in need alongside them. There is an age requirement of 18 years or older to volunteer on the construction site. All youth 16 -17 years of age must provide a waiver (printed and signed by a parent/guardian) and be accompanied by an adult for the duration of their volunteer experience. Youth under the age of 16 are not able to help with this project.

# Sign Up to Help:

- 1. Create a profile at helenahabitat.volunteerhub.com.
- 2. Once you have created an account, go to the calendar date of May 18 and click the link labeled "Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church." It will open some details and directions to the build site.
- 3. Click the sign-up button, and you will be asked to agree to their standard volunteer waiver, which is required before volunteers come to the build site.
- 4. Remember your username and password. Once you arrive, you will have to scan a QR code to start tracking your volunteer time.

Heading East on Canyon Ferry Rd., you will come to Valley Dr., you will want to take a right turn. That is the Cul-De-Sac we are building in. Feel free to park anywhere in the Cul-De-Sac.

#### **Helena Food Share Kid Packs**

Thank you for keeping the bins full of additional weekend supplements for the Kid Pack Program this year: pudding cups, granola bars, popcorn, juice cups, fruit cups, fruit snacks and more. You provided in abundance. Also, the Hunger Team gives a shout-out of gratitude to Dave Mehl, who has faithfully picked up these crates and hauled them to Helena Food Share for several years.

April 16 was our last Tuesday for assembling Kid Packs. We are beyond grateful for the amazing crew of volunteers who have shown up at the Helena Food Share Warehouse, the first three Tuesday's of each month, October-April, to assemble weekend food bags. What a gift these volunteers bring each Tuesday with smiles, compassion, dedication, and get er' done attitude. They make this happen and the children of this community are blessed by your commitment. We filled 23,288 bags, 2,911crates, and volunteers gave 504 hours of their time to this wonderful cause. Thank you!

#### Summer Milk Campaign

Yep, we wrapped up Kid Packs assemblies in April, but our quest to support this program continues. Each school year, over 44,000 cartons of milk are needed to provide this important nutritional necessity for each child receiving a Kid Pack. We are asking for compassion and help for the children of our community, one carton of a milk at a time.

On Mother's Day, May 12, the Hunger Team will launch its campaign to raise \$22,500 to provide milk for the upcoming school year. As we launch this necessary campaign for Helena Food Share, please "Don't Forget the Milk!" The Montana Synod Hunger Team has awarded the church a grant of \$800 to be matched by our Hunger Team prior to the launch of the campaign. Stay tuned for more information.

#### **Family Promise**

Our Redeemer's will be hosting Family Promise guests the week of May 12-19. Families will be housed overnight in our church, and meals will continue to be delivered to the Day Center at 2814 Cooke. We shall need folks to set up accommodations on Sunday, May 12, as well as some to tear down the rooms before worship on Sunday, May 19. We also are responsible for providing overnight hosts and meals for that week. It takes about 30 people to help provide welcoming accommodations for our quests. #### Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp Master Plan

Dan Richardson, a board member of Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp, presented information on the recently approved

master plan for the camp. He reminded the Council of the ministries of the camp, presently serving campers of all ages. Recognizing that many Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp congregation churches no longer have camper-age young people in their church and that less than half of adults in the U.S. now identify as Protestant, the board recognized the following needs:

- ⇒ the need to recruit and retain summer and year-round staff
- ⇒ the need for a master plan for facilities, infrastructure, property and land use that would best meet the needs of the camp
- ⇒ the need to provide services to congregations in the development of their youth and family ministries
- ⇒ the need for an education and innovation center for programming
- ⇒ a need for a comprehensive fundraising campaign

#### **Personnel Committee**

The Personnel Committee presented information on their work of updating the Our Redeemer's Personnel Policy Manual. The group meets twice a month and hopes to have its work completed by the end of 2024.

#### **Financial Report**

Because of generous giving during March, the Council approved to pay \$17,234.70 to the Building Fund, \$18,549.69 to the Dedicated Fund, and \$2,657.88 to the Montana Synod. The total of \$38,442.27 still leaves a cash balance of \$23,755.15. Property taxes of \$9,729.97 are due at the end of May. The Council expresses its deepest appreciation to the congregation for their generous support of the church's ministries.

#### **Ministry Team and Committee Reports**

Lots of things are happening around Our Redeemer's right now. As the preschool begins to wrap up its end-of-year activities, the search for a director is now underway. Interviews should begin soon.

Jerry Hoover and the Men's Coffee Group have done a huge amount of work in keeping the facilities in good repair. The Council expresses its appreciation to this group for the many hours of labor they give so generously to keep everything in working order.

The Hunger Team recently received two grants from the Montana Synod Hunger Team: \$800 for seed money to begin the Summer Milk Campaign, and \$600 to assist with needs for the Community Garden plot for Helena Food Share. Recently, Carroll College students assisted in preparing part of the Helena Food Share plot. The team is also working with Pastor Trina for a display and movie focusing on homelessness in the fall of 2024. The team is presently looking for a person to serve as a liaison with God's Love, to check on their needs monthly.
