Our cup overflows ...

In July, members of the committee sat down with RMDC's Executive I recently had a member of leadership share with me Director and Affordable Housing that they've been part of a lot of organizations over the vears, including a couple of other congregations, but Program Director to further discuss the proposed sale. - \$25,000 given to the All Kids to Camp in 2024 campaign
- \$45,000 raised for the new sound system installed in September
- \$26,000+ raised for milk for the Kid Packs distributed to local elementary kids (The Hunger Team just got a \$5000 grant from Town Pump, passed on to Helena Food Share, which upped this total since their last report!)
- \$51,000 given by Gordon Blomquist to establish the Blomquist Fund for Children and Youth, the proceeds of which will help kids go to camp for generations

And this is all over and above the giving for our general ministry expenses.

Thanks be to the Spirit, who has been moving us to increased generosity!

AND, we also held our first Stewardship Work Day on September 28, which ticked off everything on Jerry Hoover's "urgent" list and went deep into his "other projects" list. Thanks to all who showed up that day and shared their physical skills as a large group joined together to paint, stain, clean, scrape, weed, and trim landscape, and help with the general upkeep of our wonderful facility and campus.

Update on the property development project

Gretchen Krumm shares on behalf of the Our Redeemer's Property Development Committee:

We remain in negotiation discussions with Rocky Mountain Development Council (RMDC) regarding the land sale. Receiving an official appraisal of the 11 acres available, the Council approved the draft of a proposed Buy-Sell and Restrictive Covenants drawn up by the church's attorney in late March.

In August, there was further discussion on the sale price, agreement that RMDC would assume responsibility for required infrastructure (roads. utilities), and additional clarification on the Restrictive Covenants. Members of the Property Development Committee will again meet with RMDC staff in early November to continue the conversation.

In the meantime, the Property Development Committee also recommended that the Council move forward with the process of subdividing the property to legally identify the lot for sale. This work involves surveying the property and making an application to the city for an Administrative Minor Subdivision. This would be required regardless of when or who the property is sold to, and could take up to six months to be confirmed, so the Council agreed to move forward with this process and contract with Stahly Engineering for the survey, documentation, and application efforts. This is currently underway.

Don't forget the mortgage!

As we await the sale of the land. Our Redeemer's continues to reduce its mortgage each month. The current mortgage balance is a little over \$1.1 million, with monthly payments of almost \$11,000. Our mortgage payments are not paid by general giving to the Ministry Fund, but by those who specify a gift to the Building Fund. To provide a buffer should times get hard (remember that pandemic...), we have historically aimed to have a year's worth of mortgage payments in the Building Fund, but have been dipping into that recently as gifts in this area have decreased. While grateful for this reserve, you are encouraged to consider a gift to Building Fund as we near the end of 2024.

When they had all had enough to eat, Jesus said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." John 6:12


How much waste does your household produce? How to reduce that waste?

In Katharine Hayhoe's book, "Saving Us", it is estimated that the US throws away enough food from our plates or refrigerators each day to fill a 90,000-seat football stadium each year. Yikes! Paper Waste- Paper towels can largely be replaced with bar rags for small cleanups. (You may still need to use disposable for the worst messes.)

Use cloth napkins instead of paper ones. They can be laundered and reused many times. Paper napkins, towels, and toilet paper are also available, mostly online, made from bamboo. Why is bamboo so great? Because it grows guickly and is a more readily renewable resource than paper from trees. We can do something about caring for our creation in so many ways. September Financial Review

General Receipts for the Ministry Fund totaled \$52,990 for September. The Council agreed to pay the Synod Support amount of \$3,481.38 for August and September and to forward the Building Fund amount of \$12,042,44 for August and September (leaving only 7.5 months' worth of mortgage payments in the Building Fund reserves). They decided to hold on forwarding the Dedicated Fund donations for one more month.

2025 Budget

A draft of the 2025 budget will be ready for Council review at the November meeting. The Budget Forum is scheduled for 9:45am on Sunday, December 8.

The congregation will vote on the budget at a 9:45am meeting on Sunday, December <u>15.</u>

The annual Congregational meeting will take place on Sunday, February 9, 2025. We shall have one worship service at 9:30am that Sunday, followed by a potluck and the Congregational meeting.

Audit Committee

The Council will approve the financial policies of the church at the November meeting.

Staff Reports

• Staff reports show increased attendance at Sunday School, active Confirmation class, a fully-staffed nursery, and plans for great fall retreats for both middle schoolers and high school youth. And of course, enthusiasm is building for the Trunk or Treat event on Saturday, October 26.

- Alcoholics Anonymous has requested the use of the Community Room on Tuesday evenings. The Council approved this request.



What is the ORLC Perpetual Fund?

On January 21, 1991, the Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church (ORLC) congregation adopted the Perpetual Fund. This endowment fund was created to hold gifts in trust, ensuring that they support the programs and missions of the church for generations to come.

How does the fund work?

Donations made to the fund are invested and held in trust forever, in perpetuity. This means the original amount given is not spent, only the income it generates. The Fund is managed by five trustees appointed by the ORLC church council for a three-year term. Trustees are responsible for distributing income from the Fund in ways that align with the church's mission and vision. Unlike the regular Ministry Fund, the Perpetual Fund is intended to be forward-looking, supporting new programs and expanding our church's reach, rather than just maintaining day-today operations. Examples of new programs include the sanctuary prayground, the chalkboard, and postcard mailings to our neighborhood.

What are the sub-funds?

In addition to the main Perpetual Fund (General Fund), there are two "sub-funds" that serve specific purposes: The Seminary Scholarship Sub-fund, established in December 2003, was created by a donor to provide grants to seminary students. Priority is given to members of ORLC, followed by members of other ELCA congregations in Lewis & Clark, Broadwater, Powell and Jefferson counties. This fund has made grants to five ORLC member seminary students.

A Debt & Maintenance Sub-Fund, established in 2012, provides supplemental payments toward church debt. If there is no debt, the income is added to the Ministry Fund Reserve For Maintenance Account. Over \$30,000 has been applied to reducing building fund debt.
