Installation of Pastor Trina Johnsten at Our Redeemer's Lutheran, Helena

You are invited to a Service of Holy Communion and Installation on **Sunday, October 23 at 4:00pm**, as the people of Our Redeemer's welcome their new lead pastor, Rev. Trina Johnsten. Special guest preacher will be Rev. Dr. David J. Lose, senior pastor of Mount Olivet Lutheran (Minneapolis), with Rev. Jason Asselstine, Associate to the Bishop of the Montana Synod, officiating. All are invited to worship in person at 3580 North Benton Ave, Helena, Montana, 59602. The service will also be livestreamed, with a link on the front page of Our Redeemer's website (OurRedeemerLives.Org).

Clergy who attend are invited to process. The color of the day will be green. There will be a reception following the service.

Dr. Lose will also be preaching at the two morning services (8:30 and 11:00).

As I write this, I've been back for two weeks now in my new role as lead pastor at Our Redeemer's, and I must say that it's been the easiest job transition I've ever had! Thank you for the warm welcome home.

It certainly feels like things are in full swing around here again. We're back to two services on Sunday and Wednesday evening worship. Youth group, Confirmation, and Sunday School are meeting again. Offering Confirmation twice a week appears to have been a good decision; we've had 22 students attend in the first week, double the average weekly attendance of last year. Director of Children's Ministries, Liz Swenson reports that the first week of Sunday School saw one of the largest classes she's had in the four years she's been on staff: 13 sweet kiddos, with 14 attending the *KidsTime* offered during worship that same morning. I dropped in on the first bell/chime rehearsal, and there were 17 in attendance learning good techniques from Autumn Keller, and the choir seems to grow each time they bless worship with their musical offering.

Pastors in Montana report that worship attendance and program participation have not bounced back from the Covid restrictions that began March 2020, which is also true across the nation; however, we seem to be bucking that trend. Our Redeemer's average weekly worship attendance in 2019 was 267. In the last two weeks in September, we averaged 263 between our three services and online watchers. Thanks be to God for your faithfulness after a challenging season in our collective lives together. I promise that regularly hearing the Word and joining together for the Meal will bless you and strengthen you for all the other things you deal with during the week. But it appears you already know that... :)

Even though we've come through a year's interim together and now entered into what feels like a more settled time, Our Redeemer's is still in the midst of transition as we seek to return to a staffing level that is more in line with the size and needs of the congregation. There's not a week that goes by that I don't miss the good work of Pastor Kendra. Much of what she did, like teaching confirmation, baptism preparation, first communion and Bible classes, and oversight of pastoral care, requires theological training and can't just be passed on to other current staff or volunteers. Not to mention her excellent preaching and creative assistance with worship.

And so, you will see that Council is forging ahead with the formation of a Call Committee for an associate pastor. Please prayerfully consider if you have the interest and time necessary for this important ministry opportunity and reach out to Lynn Voss with nominations. And a heartfelt thank you to all who are helping with worship leadership, preaching, music, teaching, visiting, welcoming, and the host of other things that need some extra coverage right now.

Only a couple of weeks back and I've been astounded at the depth of our confirmands' questions about faith, had communion wafers blow away during campfire worship on a Wednesday night, plunged a toilet, watched several of you bleed for the Red Cross in the Community Room, laughed hard over food choices for my upcoming installation (there will *not* be pepperoni or mayonnaise), and many, many times given thanks for the opportunity to be in ministry with you in this place and in this time.

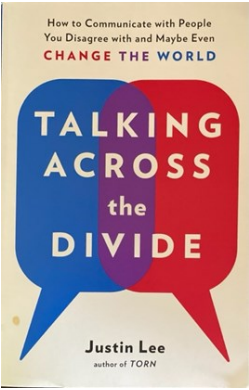

Prior to the meeting, Brett Penner took a photo of the Council to be posted on the ORLC website.

Lynn called the meeting to order at 6:00pm and Pastor Trina opened the meeting with prayer.

Financial Report

Beth and Sarah reported that August giving was among the lowest month that they can remember. Receipts for the General Fund totaled \$32,601 which is \$15,338 less than the 2022 plan. Building fund donations for August totaled \$7,832 which is \$3,101 less than plan. The positive cash balance is \$6,288.69. Council voted to hold all Council Funds, Building Funds, and Benevolence for August. Sarah noted that the Property Tax is due in November. There was discussion about conveying budget information at a temple talk to inform the congregation about the budget status in keeping with the desire for more transparent communication. Lynn will present a temple talk at the September 25 services.

Decisions yet need to be made on cost of living increases for staff; how to handle benevolences for local partners; and which ongoing activities should be built into the budget (e.g. Vacation Bible School and increased postage for community outreach).

Sarah reported the Tri-County technician recommended not to override the HVAC controller. The HVAC system uses all the bells and whistles that are controlled by the controller and the system would not operate to its full potential or efficiently without it.

Ministry Team Reports

Pastor Trina reported that during the four weeks she was out she attended the Catholic Diocese dedication of the Jewish synagogue. She also helped with the Confirmation orientation and helped with the opening days of the Preschool. Since her return to permanent status she has been meeting with staff to establish her expectations and further program planning. Her Installation will be held on Sunday, October 23, at 4:00pm followed by a reception. There is a reception planning team working out the details of that event.

Cody reported that the City/County approved their budget and now the Team is communicating with officials more

directly about the Property Development Plan. Kim Mangold was added as a new member of the Property Development Team. Kim brings experience as a former deputy director for the Department of Agriculture and a member of the YWCA Board of Directors. Cody reported that the Independent Record will publish an article next week on the project.

Tracy reported that the Preschool Board met the previous evening and the members are very engaged. They elected officers, went through a budget orientation, discussed fundraising, and other topics. Opening days have gone smoothly. Kris Thatcher's contract as Interim Director expires at the end of the calendar year. Council will revisit her contract with consideration of extending it through the school year.

Kevin reported on the Outreach and Welcome Committee. The picnic went well and Installation planning is ongoing.

Jan reported that the Generosity Committee will be meeting this Sunday (September 25) and rebuilding their momentum from the summer break. All are welcome to attend.

Beth reported the Hunger Team provided a \$14,001.77 check to Food Share from the summer Milk Campaign. The Team continues to harvest food from the garden.

Old Business

Cody reported that the Internet was upgraded last month and it is six times faster than previously. The Upgrade is saving the church \$75 per month.

Kevin reported that he and Dave Mehl are continuing exploring better building signage. Kevin also reported that the Audit Committee will meet and begin their work soon.

Lynn reported that he has been gathering more information on the Lighting Replacement Proposal. Lynn suggested the Council revisit this project at the next meeting.

Council discussed next steps for a Call Committee for the Associate Pastor position. Jan will resurrect her nomination document from last time. Individuals can nominate themselves or someone they recommend. Nominations should be delivered to Lynn by October 16. Council will meet to review the nominations and establish the committee members. Meanwhile, Lynn will contact Pastor Jason Asselstine in the Synod Office to see when he might be available to meet with the newly established Call Committee.

New Business

Lynn reported that Lori Walter identified individuals who have not participated in the life of the congregation for several years - beyond the years of the pandemic. Lynn reviewed those names with the Council. Council accepted the names of those individuals to be put into "inactive status." Those numbers will not be included in the Church's Annual Report for current membership.

From the Independent Records “20 Under 40”:

It was while attending Catholic Mass as a young boy that Jason Callon, director of worship and arts at Our Redeemer’s Lutheran Church, first discovered his love and appreciation for music.

“Music has a deep place in my soul,” said Callon, reflecting on his earliest musical experiences. “Being in the midst of music puts me in a place that is comforting, and I feel at peace when listening to it or playing it,” said Callon.

Originally from Washington state, Callon studied music at Saint Martin’s University in Lacey, Washington. He later relocated to Montana for his wife’s job and has remained actively involved in Helena’s musical community ever since.

Within his role at Our Redeemer’s, Callon currently leads a variety of different musical ensembles. He has hopes to expand the church’s music program in the future though by getting more of the congregation involved and possibly even putting on a concert series with professional musicians.

“The church has a really bright future,” said Callon.

In addition to his work at Our Redeemer’s, Callon is also an instructor with Ironhorse Consortium for Young Musicians, where he leads musical ensembles and teaches classes on music technology and theory.

Additionally, he serves as a music instructor as part of the Last Chance Music Camp.

Callon acknowledged that while, originally, he never had any intentions to teach music, the experience has opened his eyes to the talent and capabilities of young people.

“They have a deep capacity to understand complex and abstract concepts,” said Callon.

For Callon, the most rewarding part of his work is getting to experience and share in the moments when those concepts click for his students.

When Callon isn’t busy teaching music, he serves as a substitute percussionist with the Helena Symphony and provides live sound for events like the Governor’s Cup and Helena Street Rodder’s Car Show through his small business — Helena Tech Pro.

“Music and art speak to the soul in a way that little else can,” said Callon. “When you’ve had a bad day, music and art are always there for you to turn to. They offer a way to nurture you mentally, psychologically, and spiritually like nothing else can.”
